Books by Louise Penney, Canadian author. Her mysteries are set in Quebec. Chief Inspector Armand Gamache, the Surete du Quebec, and the Village of Three Pines are the centerpieces of her 17 (now 18 with the latest co-authored by Hilary Clinton) suspense-filled novels. The frigid snowy landscapes were particularly soothing during this hot summer in Florida!
